Grateful: Showing an appreciation of kindness.

Grown Folk: Adults.

Half-frightened: Expression meaning frightened but not excessively so.

In the least: At all.

Jar: A sudden forceful shake or movement.

Oh, gracious!: Expression similar to 'Oh my God'. To ask for God's intervention.

Pleaded: Asked or begged.

Pleats: Folds in cloth made by doubling over the fabric on itself.

Point: The top of the hat.

Quadlings: A race of beings that lives in the South region of Oz.

Shod: Wearing shoes of some kind.

Slate: A board with slate stone to write on and to erase with chalk.

Sorceress: A female user of magic. Another name for a witch.

Straightway: Immediately.

Swift: Happening quickly or promptly.

Wicked Witch: A witch that is even and has bad intentions.

Winkies: A race of beings that lives in the West region of Oz.
